Upcoming game: College Basketball Invitational (CBI) Tournament presented by Zebra Pen

Creighton, Tuesday, March 15, Qwest Center Arena, Omaha, Neb., 7:05 p.m. (CDT)/5:05 p.m. (PDT)

San Jose State record: 17-15, 5-11 WAC. The Spartans are in the midst of their first winning season since 1994. San Jose State advanced to the Western Athletic Conference Tournament semifinal round before losing to #23-ranked and conference champion Utah State, 58-54, on March 11. San Jose State's 17 wins are the most in one season since 1981.

Creighton record: 19-14, 10-8 Missouri Valley Conference. The Bluejays advanced to the Missouri Valley Conference Tournament semifinal round before losing to Missouri State, 60-50 on March 5.

At stake: The San Jose State-Creighton winner faces the winner of the James Madison-Davidson encounter, Monday, March 21, in a CBI second-round game. Site and game time will be announced following the conclusion of both contests.

San Jose State head coach George Nessman: Completing his sixth season as head coach. Has a major college coaching record of 68-118, all with the Spartans. He is the first San Jose State coach in 11 years to lead a Spartan team to at least 15 wins in a season, direct a team to two wins in one Western Athletic Conference Tournament and the first Spartan coach in 15 years to take a team to a national post-season tournament. As a head coach, Nessman is 0-0 in national post-season tournament games and 0-0 against Creighton.

Creighton head coach Greg McDermott: Finishing his first season with the Bluejays. Has a record of 19-14 at Creighton. Overall, McDermott is in his 17th season as a major college head coach with a 299-209 record. He is 0-0 as a head coach against San Jose State.

San Jose State-Creighton series: The Bluejays lead the series, 3-0. These teams are facing each other for the first time since December 5, 1988.

Post-season history: San Jose State returns to national post-season basketball action for the first time since 1996. The Spartans are playing in their first College Basketball Invitational tournament.

17 wins for the first time since 1981: For the first time since 1981, San Jose State is at 17-win plateau.

Below are the five Spartan teams that produced 17 or more wins since 1950 when San Jose State declared its major college playing status. Nine other teams prior to 1950 won 17 or more games in a season.

50 percent against post-season teams: Half of San Jose State's 32-game schedule to date is against teams playing either in the NCAA, NIT, CBI or CIT events. The Spartans are 6-10 against these teams and have wins over CIT teams Idaho, twice; Hawai'i, San Francisco and Oregon, once each; and CBI participant Weber State. Utah State and Texas-San Antonio are the two San Jose State opponents playing for the NCAA Championship.

Facing the Missouri Valley: Creighton is one of six Missouri Valley Conference opponents in San Jose State's basketball history. The Spartans are 2-10 with wins against Wichita State in 1978 and Illinois State in 1977. Previously, San Jose State played Drake, Indiana State, Evansville.

Another Korver: Kaleb Korver is the second of the four Korver brothers who could play in a basketball game against San Jose State. Klayton Korver, his older brother, scored 16 points and collected 12 rebounds in Drake's 2005 win over the Spartans in a non-conference contest on BracketBuster weekend. Kaleb was born in Los Angeles, Calif., approximately 350 miles south of San Jose.

Spartans in WAC Tournament semifinal: For the first time in its 16 seasons as a Western Athletic Conference member, San Jose State advanced to the conference tournament's semifinal round. As the #8-seed, the Spartans topped #5-Hawai'i, 75-74, and #4-seed Idaho, 74-68, before losing to #1-seed Utah State, 58-54.

Oliver on WAC All-Tournament team: Guard **Adrian Oliver** was named to the 2011 WAC All-Tournament team. Oliver was the leading scorer in the tournament scoring 73 points in three games. He is the first San Jose State player to be voted to a WAC All-Tournament team since the Spartans joined the conference in July, 1996..

All-WAC selections: Guards **Adrian Oliver** and **Justin Graham** were named to the 2010-11 Western Athletic Conference post-season honors teams.

Oliver became the first San Jose State player to earn two first-team All-WAC honors since the Spartans joined the conference in 1996. He leads the conference in scoring with a 24.3 points per game average.

Graham, second on the Spartans in scoring at 14.8 per game and the new school career recordholder in assists, was named an honorable mention selection and to the All-Defensive team. Graham is the San Jose State single-season and career recordholder in steals.

The selections of Oliver and Graham are just the second time two Spartans received All-WAC recognition in one season. In 2003, forward **Antonio Lawrence** was named to the All-Newcomer team and guard **Brandon Hawkins** was named to the All-Defensive team.

2011 - highest scoring Spartan team: The 2,317 points scored by the 2011 San Jose State team is a school record for team points scored in a season. The 2010 Spartans held the record for one season with 2,289 points in 31 games.

70-point threshold: San Jose State is 15-5 in games scoring 70 or more points. San Jose State enters the Creighton game averaging 72.4 points a contest.

Three-point shooting rise: Six times in the last 13 games, San Jose State made at least 50 percent of its three-point field goal tries. The Spartans had a season best 61.5 percent (8-of-13) in the March 3 Hawai'i game and converted a season-high 13 three-pointers in the March 10 Idaho win in the WAC Tournament. In the last 13 games, the Spartans converted 43.4 percent (92-of-212) from three-point range.

Free throw shooting on target: San Jose State is one of the best free throw shooting teams nationally ranking among the top-30 teams. Eleven times this season, the Spartans converted at least 80.0 percent of their free throws in a game. San Jose State made 45-of-56 (80.4 percent) of its free throws at the WAC Tournament.

San Jose State has a 75.7 percent team free throw percentage - 2.9 percentage points higher than last season's school record of 72.8 percent heading into the CBI game against Creighton.

Six road wins in 2010-11: San Jose State's 92-89 double-overtime win at Idaho was the Spartans' sixth road win of the season. The 1993-94 team, with seven road wins, is the last San Jose State squad with at least six road victories.

Close calls: San Jose State is 6-1 in games decided by three points or less this season. Two of the five wins are directly attributable to plays made by Justin Graham on San Jose State's final possession.

In the December 12 Eastern Washington victory, the Spartans guard scored the game-winning basket with 6.1 seconds remaining for an 80-79 win.

In the November 20 triumph at Oregon, Graham scored a conventional three-point play with 2.8 seconds left in a 75-72 road victory.

San Jose State also has the 75-74 win over Hawaii in the WAC Tournament, an 80-77 victory over UC Riverside, a 92-89 double-overtime triumph over Idaho and a 72-70 overtime win against New Mexico State.

The 102-101 four-overtime loss to Boise State is the team's one loss by three-points or less this season.

Five February wins: The Spartans finished February with a 5-2 record, the team's first winning record in February since the 2001 team was 5-3 en route to a 14-14 overall record.

The 2010-11 team's .714 winning percentage for February is the best since the 1977 team posted a .778 winning percentage on a 7-2 record in the year's shortest month.

Longest homestand in 42 years: For the first time since the 1968-69 season, San Jose State played at least six consecutive home games. The Spartans were 4-2 during the homestand.

Points allowed going down: In San Jose State's last eight games, the opposition averaged 64.9 points an outing. In the five games before the long February homestand, San Jose State's opponents averaged 79.0 points a contest.

Four overtime games: The February 23 overtime win over New Mexico State was San Jose State's fourth overtime game of the season. The Spartans are 2-2 in overtime games in 2010-11 and lead the WAC with eight overtime periods played. Boise State, 2-1 in overtime games, is the only other conference member to play more than three overtime periods this season with six.

The 2010-11 Spartans are the fourth San Jose State team to play four or more overtime games in a season. The 1994 and 2001 Spartans played four overtime games and the 1985 team has the school record with five overtime games.

10 non-conference wins in 2010-11: For the first time since the 1979-80 season, a San Jose State team has at least 10 non-conference victories. The 2010-11 team has a 10-3 non-conference win-loss mark. Nine of the 10 wins are against Division I opponents with four victories coming on the road.

Most Division I non-conference wins: With the Weber State win, San Jose State's nine Division I non-conference victories in 2010-11 matches the 2008 and 1976 teams for the Spartans' most Division I non-conference game triumphs since 1970.

Starting points: Twice this season, in the 92-89 double overtime win at Idaho and in the 62-47 victory over Weber State, the San Jose State starting five accounted for all the team's points. The Spartans' reserves took just four of the team's 76 field goal tries in the Idaho triumph and six of 52 shots against Weber State.

90 or more points: The Idaho win (2/3) is the third time this season San Jose State scored 90 or more points in a game. The 1993-94 team's four 90-plus point games are the last time the Spartans scored 90 or more points at least three times in a season.

Double-digit comeback: The double-overtime Idaho win is the first time in 2010-11, San Jose State overcame a double-digit deficit. The Spartans trailed, 64-54 with 1:55 left in the second half, before sending the game into overtime, 66-66. San Jose State outlasted Idaho, 92-89, in a two-overtime triumph.

Oliver Top-5 scorer: San Jose State guard **Adrian Oliver** enters the CBI third nationally in scoring average at 24.3. In four of the last 10 games, Oliver scored 30 or more points.

Oliver will become the first San Jose State player and first among the Bay Area's six NCAA Division I schools (San Jose State, Stanford, California, San Francisco, Saint Mary's and Santa Clara) to finish in the top-10 nationally in scoring more than once in a career. In 2009-10, Oliver tied for fourth in scoring at 22.5 points per game.

Oliver - #2 in career scoring: With 30 points in the February 12 San Jose State-Nevada game, **Adrian Oliver** moved into second place on the San Jose State career scoring list and now has 1,736 points. The late **Ricky Berry** (1986-88) is the only San Jose State player ahead of Oliver with 1,767 points.

Graham Records: In 2010-11, **Justin Graham** became San Jose State's new career leader in assists and single-season leader in steals. He entered the season as the career leader in steals.

February 23 vs. New Mexico State - career assists record, 478

February 12 vs. Nevada - single-season steals record, 52

1,000 points, 400 rebounds, 400 assists: In the January 13 Louisiana Tech win, **Justin Graham** became the first San Jose State player to score at least 1,000 points, collect 400 rebounds and hand out 400 assists in a career. Among current Western Athletic Conference member schools, only five players currently are at this statistical plateau.

Double-figure rebounding: Six Spartans, **Adrian Oliver, Wil Carter, Justin Graham, Chris Jones, Brylle Kamen** and **Matt Ballard**, were credited with at least 10 rebounds in a game this season. At least since 2003, no Spartan team finished a season with six different players having a season high of 10 or more rebounds. During George Nessman's five-plus seasons, no more than four players in a season had 10 or more rebounds in a game.

Rebounding best: San Jose State produced its best rebounding game of the season in the Seattle University win with a +16 advantage, 49-33. Five times this season (at Oregon, at UC Irvine, at Seattle, Puget Sound and Boise State), the Spartans had a +10 or higher rebounding margin and are 4-1 in these games.

Oliver & Carter Double Up: Three times this season, guard **Adrian Oliver** and forward **Wil Carter** each produced a "double-double" in the same game. San Jose State is 3-0 in games when these two each produce a "double-double."

The Spartans are 4-0 in games this season when any two San Jose State players record a 'double-double' in the same game. Carter and reserve **Chris Jones** did it in the UC Irvine win (12/4/10).

Two 1,000-point Spartans as teammates: The 2011 San Jose State squad is the first Spartan team in school history with more than one player scoring 1,000 or more points for a career on the same team. **Adrian Oliver** scored his 1,000th point in the final game of the 2010 season. **Justin Graham** joined Oliver as a 1,000-point scorer on December 31, 2010.

Double-figure scoring: In the Seattle University (12/18) and UC Irvine (12/4) victories, San Jose State had five players in double-figure scoring.

Assists-to-turnover ratios: San Jose State, Utah State, Boise State and Fresno State are the four WAC teams currently with more assists than turnovers this season. The Spartans are +38; the Aggies, +100; Fresno State, +11; and Boise State, +23. Only four

of the 13 Spartans have more turnovers than assists at the end of the regular season.

Reviewing records from the 1990 season to the present, no San Jose State team finished a season with more assists than turnovers.

Low turnover count: The Spartans are averaging only 11.1 turnovers per game. Sixteen times this season, the Spartans committed 10 or fewer turnovers in a game.

In the December 12 win over Eastern Washington, the Spartans were charged with a season-low four turnovers - the fewest turnovers in a game since the 2006 Hawai'i contest when San Jose State had five.

The Spartans are 11-5 in games with 10 or fewer turnovers this season

Multiple WAC Players of the Week: For the first time since the 1998-99 season, more than one San Jose State player received WAC Player of the Week recognition in a season. **Justin Graham** was the WAC Player of the Week for games ending December 5; **Adrian Oliver**, for games concluding December 26.

60 January Minutes With Boise State: The four-overtime game against Boise State on January 6 matched the January 10, 1985, 97-92 four overtime win at Cal State Fullerton as the longest San Jose State men's basketball game.

Game milestones include:

- San Jose State's first game scoring at least 100 points since January 25, 1979 in a 101-85 win over Utah State.
- San Jose State's first time scoring 100 or more points in 914 games.
- **Justin Graham** became the second San Jose State player to play 60 minutes in a game. In the 1985 game at Cal State Fullerton, center **Matt Fleming** played the entire contest.
- Matched the longest game involving a Western Athletic Conference team. On March 3, 1983, New Mexico won at Hawai'i, 63-61 in four overtimes.

A Pac-10 win: San Jose State's win at Oregon was the first by the Spartans over a Pac-10 team since a 56-52 triumph over Stanford at The Event Center on December 3, 1992. The Spartans had lost 10 in a row to Pac-10 Conference members. The Oregon win at Oregon also ended a 12-game, 24-year drought of winless efforts on Pac-10 Conference homecourts.
